# **ABOUT EDUSPOTS**

EduSpots is a small but growing charity that exists to connect, train, and equip local volunteers who ignite change through education spaces called 'Spots'. We have trained and connected over 300 passionate 'Catalysts' like Nimatu (below) from 50 underserved communities in Ghana and Kenya., who support 15,000 users each year. We are proud of our innovative low-cost and community-led model which we believe could have applications across the world.

#### Why do we exist?

In our communities, learning resources are scarce and classroom provision is variable. As one example of challenges relating to the low income context, many volunteers report teenage pregnancy to be high, with many girls turning to sexual contact as a means of securing money for basic needs such as sanitary provision. However, our Catalysts (a mix of teachers, students and community members) are ready to be the solution.

#### Who leads our Spots?

The Spots are led and owned by community committees comprising local educational leaders, traditional leaders, political leaders, teachers, students, and parents. These committees build local volunteer teams who we connect centrally via WhatsApp, national and regional conferences, and our three leadership programmes.

#### What do they do?

Alongside opening the Spots as learning spaces, our Catalysts lead a range of clubs in early years development, literacy, STEM and sustainability education, and girls' empowerment, alongside locally designed projects, supported by our Ghanaian staff team, 50% of whom are drawn from the volunteer network. Together, we are building a movement of community educators.

- We won the 2022 Big Give Supporters' Choice Award.
- Our Founder was a finalist for the \$1 million UNESCO-backed Global Teacher Prize.

- We won the 2018 Tes International Award in 2018.

# **01. STUDENTS LEARN ABOUT A COMMUNITY AND SEE THE DIRECT IMPACT OF FUNDRAISING**

Students and/or staff can become EduSpots Ambassadors, with a structured and certificated opportunity to learn, act and reflect. Students build teams, promote our work more widely, fundraise and lead resource collections. This is perfect as a Duke of Edinburgh's Award or CAS project.

## **03. STUDENTS LEAD A 'SPOTS FOR EDUSPOTS' DAY!**

Lead a spot-themed home clothes day or event in support of one of our Spots. We can show you the direct impact of your funds, and our Founder is happy to give in-person talks or organise remote workshops with community volunteers. You could choose a UN international day: International Day of Education, World Book Day, or International Children's Day - we can provide you with learning resources for tutor group sessions or assemblies.

#### **04. STUDENTS TAKE OUR ONLINE COURSES**

We offer four six-week online courses in global development, postcolonial thinking, leadership and social entrepreneurship. Students from African and European contexts share ideas via our discussion board. Students who are fundraising can take these courses for free with certificates of pass, distinction and 'top in cohort' awarded. ## WHAT COULD YOUR FUNDRAISING SUPPORT?
