



Catalysts should expect the following from EduSpots

- 1. Timely communication of all programme activities by staff.
- 2. Full funding of residential Academy (transport, accommodation, food)
- 3. Support with data costs for participation in the Spot Lead strand & Catalyse workshops
- 4. Strong mentorship from regional coordinators who understand the Spot context.
- 5. Recognition and celebration of your achievements and efforts, including certificiatipon and graduation, and social media storytelling.
- 6. Support with resources for your Spot, including Keeping Spots Safe kits.
- 7. A high quality of training and wider programme delivery, based on inputs from Catalysts across the network.
- 8. Opportunity for a grant if you have a sustainable plan for your project.

Programme Structure



1. Community assets assessment

Selected Catalysts will complete a community and Spots needs and assets assessment, also evaluating their own skills and knowledge through the Impact Ed baseline survey. The April theme for Spot Lead is to assess and map the assets in your community with your teams. This task must be completed before joining the Catalyse Academy.

2. Active engagement in the Spot Lead strand

All selected Catalyse participants are expected to be active participants of the Spot Lead strand and accompanying online Catalyse Workshops, inspiring wider Catalysts with their energy and ideas and participating in the monthly Spot Lead challenges, working alongside other team members at their Spots.

3. The Catalyse Leadership Academy

The Academy will be delivered by our in-house staff team alongside specialist speakers. The Catalysts will meet their mentors, our Regional Coordinators, three of whom are past graduates of the Catalyst Leadership Programme. Specific details are as follows:

Core information

-Transportation

- 1. Plan to set off on your journey early enough so as not to travel at night.
- 2. Choose the safest and most economical route to travel.
- 3. All travel costs will be reimbursed to and from your current location.

-Food

- 1. Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided each day.
- 2. All meals will be eaten together at set times.
- 3. Please let us know in advance if you have any special dietary needs

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-Timings

- 1. Plan to arrive on the evening of Monday, 28th April 2025
- 2. Check-in will take place shortly after arrival and dinner is at 7:00-7:30 pm. Risk assessments briefing will follow up right afterwards
- 3. Breakfast is from 7:00 to 8:30am each day
- 4. Plan to arrive at the training venue (Akumadan Spot) at least 10 minutes before commencement of each session.

-Accommodation

- 1. Each attendee will be allocated a room at a place of lodging
- 2. These rooms will be shared with other attendees of the same gender.
- 3. Respect others by keeping the rooms tidy and keeping noise to a minimum.

-Dress

- 1. We will be providing a t-shirt to wear for the duration of the training; please bring another EduSpots t-shirt to wear during the Academy.
- 2. Bring African wear for the final night of reflection and fun.

-Travel essentials

1. Please do not forget to carry along resources that you might need at this conference to support your learning, such as pens, paper, and technology where you have access to it. Please remember to bring your EduSpots tablet as well.

-Ways of working

- 1. We learn collaboratively. Allow the opinions and inputs of others and listen attentively.
- 2. Speak up and share your thoughts and suggestions, but try to keep contributions concise and to the point.
- 3. Kindly put your phones on do-not-disturb mode to ensure that you are not distracted during key sessions. Please do not scroll through your phone or accept calls during sessions.
- 4. Catalysts should let Kennedy know when they want to leave the designated premises to nearby locations but note that attendees do this at their own risk, and EduSpots cannot take responsibility for incidents that may occur.

- 5. We encourage all attendees to be punctual to the conference venue and during meals.
- 6. Attendees should ensure that they stay in the allocated areas for the main event and lodging.

-Health and Safety

- 1. A risk assessment has been carried out at the conference venue (Akumadan Spot). All instructions will be conveyed to participants upon arrival and at the start of the conference

RESOURCE DISTRIBUTION:



In 2024, we provided all participating Catalysts with tablets to be tested in their communities as part of the ongoing digitalisation process.

 For this academy, we aim to distribute a wider range of educational resources and books that include all the strand challenges, which will be printed and shared with the Catalysts.

What follows after the Academy.

After completing the Academy, you will receive continuous assistance from a team of Regional Coordinators to help you navigate through the subsequent stages of the Catalyse Leadership programme, which include monthly online workshops, Spot lead challenges, and completing the Catalyse Project. These 5 stages are as follows:

- Designing a Catalyse Project to drive a sustainable change in your community.
- Applying for grant and resource funding to support this.
- Joining the Spot Leadership programme, engaging in monthly workshops and challenges with your Spot teams.
- Executing your project in the community through the Spot.
- Reflecting and reporting on the impact you have created.

5. Development of a 'Catalyse Project' & Grant Funding Opportunity

Related to one or more of the areas above, Catalysts will set out a strategy to lead a strategic change at their Spots that must, in some way:

- a. Increase the quality of learning or reach of educational opportunities for learners.
- b. Ensure the sustainability of that change.
- c. Ensure the growth of their skills as a Catalyst in the process.

Following approval of the strategy, Catalysts execute this in their communities, writing a report on their approach and impact after six months. Examples will be given to Catalysts, but projects should be led by community needs and aspirations, linking to the Dream Spot Model. Possibilities could include: an extensive team-building strategy, the creation of a new community-led event, initiative or club (e.g. breast cancer screening, literacy festival, quiz event, etc), an enterprise project to drive a sustainable impact, creating a farming project linked to the Spot, educating learners in the process etc.

They will be eligible to apply for a small flexible grant to support their project (contingent on key Spot information and safeguarding requirements being in place, alongside a sustainable plan for change).

Example from last year.

Mohammed Fuseini (Dulugu Spot) - Promoting Practical STEM Education

Mohammed Fuseini successfully led a project at Dulugu Spot aimed at increasing girls' interest in science. The project engaged 30 girls from three local schools, using surveys and interviews to understand their challenges in learning science. The team then designed and delivered practical, hands-on STEM lessons both in their schools and at the Spot. As a result, the girls showed increased interest and confidence in science, with follow-up interviews confirming a positive shift in their engagement and enthusiasm for the subject.



6. Monthly Capacity Building sessions: Catalyst workshops

Catalyse Workshops are dynamic, interactive sessions designed to equip Catalysts with practical leadership, project management, and community engagement skills. These workshops provide a platform for peer learning, hands-on activities, and reflective discussions aligned with monthly themes and Spot Lead challenges

7. WhatsApp Community

The Catalyse WhatsApp Community is an online space for all selected Catalysts to stay connected and keep learning together. It serves as a learning hub where participants can share ideas, ask questions, get reminders, and access extra resources that build on what they learn in the Catalyse Workshops.

8..1-1 mentoring and Spot visits

To ensure Catalysts effectively apply learning from the residential training and lead their Catalyse Projects successfully, they will receive ongoing support over a six-month period through:

- 1:1 mentoring from an experienced Regional Coordinator.
- Spot visits that offer mutual learning opportunities between staff and Catalysts.

9. Impact report, presentations

- All Catalysts will complete a final impact form, with the opportunity to apply for a distinction by presenting their Catalyse Impact project online or during our national conference
- We will also ask for a reference from the Spot Project Leader and visit the Spot community.

10. Graduation event

 Graduation will take place at the next national conference in December, where some Catalysts will lead presentations on their work and impact to the wider network.



CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS



Expectations

Expectations of Catalysts Enrolled in the Catalyst Leadership Programme

- 1. Strong communication on any challenges faced and consistent responses to messages sent by WhatsApp, phone call or email.
- 2. Completion of all tasks in line with the agreed time frames, or otherwise strong communication of challenges faced.
- 3. Full engagement in the Spot Lead strand every Catalyst enrolled in the programme should complete the monthly Spot Lead challenges with their team as a programme requirement. This is a core requirement.
- 4. Being an Ambassador for EduSpots across the network we would like the network to be infused with your energy, updates and passion!
- 5. Adequate reporting on all grant funding received: Any grant funding needs to be reported in line with the policy explained at the Catalyse Leadership Academy. Funds will be returned if not used within the specified time frame. Catalysts who misuse funds will be required to refund the money.
- 6. Completion of all surveys (start, post-Academy, and end of programme), alongside the writing of an impact report and the quarterly Spot information collection.
- 7. Use of resources (including tablets) in line with agreed aims.
- 8. Active involvement in the development of EduSpots as an organisation - we value your input to strategic direction and request your active involvement in organisational discussions and decision-making.

Note that we will ask you to sign an agreement relating to the above ahead of joining the programme.

Risk mitigation steps

Remember that you are putting both yourself and EduSpots at risk if you are travelling on EduSpots "business" and not taking safety precautions. Therefore:

1. Prepare to travel:

- a. Pack all your luggage in advance and book your travel ticket in advance (where applicable)
- b. Make sure your phone(s) are fully charged
- c. If you are traveling in groups, make sure you agree on the time to arrive at the station
- d. Do not carry any medications or narcotics on you unless medications that have been prescribed by a qualified physician

2. Take precautions on the day of travel:

- a. On the day of travel, make sure to leave home early but avoid traveling at odd hours
- b. Do not travel on a motorbike unless it is the only option available and if so always wear a helmet on a motorbike and tell the rider to keep to a maximum speed of 30km per hour
- c. Notify the Leadership Programmes Manager (Faad: +233533729036) as soon as your car sets off and provide an estimated time of arrival
- d. Always use a seatbelt in the car/minibus if available and make sure you do proper inspection of the car before you board. This includes conducting basic safety checks on vehicles and switching vehicles where there appears to be any safety risk. Where appropriate, check your driver ahead of trips, especially in the big group buses - e.g. test of breath and a sense-check conversation (test of use of alcohol/drugs)
- e. Where you suspect that your driver is overspeeding, kindly request that drivers drive at a sensible speed (in the case of a motor bike, this must be said to the motorbike driver ahead of the trip starting).
- f. If you are involved in an accident, the first priority should be making sure you're not in any further danger, and that everyone is ok. Only get into any discussions with other parties involved in the accident after this.
- g. Avoiding being alone in remote areas, 1-1 with a driver.

3. On arrival

- a. Contact the Leadership Programmes Manager for direction to the venue
- b. Complete your registration in order to gain access to your room as well as Academy resources such as:
 - Academy resources pack
 - Name Tag
 - Roomkey
 - EduSpots T-shirt
 - Resources for your Spot
- c. Ensure that you do not share specific room details such as location/ room number with any person(s) who are not participating in the academy and do not share room information of other participants with any persons outside EduSpots.
- d. Make sure to keep all your belongings safe including your phones and digital devices. Do not give access to your room to any other person other than your roommate.
- e. Ensure that you do not leave your room at odd hours to any other event or for any other purposes other than the Catalyse Academy.
- f. Do not drink alcohol or engage in any activities that would cause damage to the EduSpots brand and reputation
