## WORD OF THE WEEK:

trait

#### **Definition:**

# PROBLEM OF THE WEEK: HOW CAN WE BEGIN A STORY?

#### **ACTIVITIES:**

- 1. Group leader reads out a passage from a book which has a description of a character or of multiple characters and there is a discussion about how the description made the pupils feel.
- 2. Pupils discuss how characters are presented and the different types of characters, for example:
  - Protagonist (main character), antagonist (villain), secondary characters
     (supporting characters)
  - Description of the physical appearance
  - Description of the personality of each character
  - How do characters speak and interact with one another
- 3. In pairs, pupils read their own books and share how a particular character they liked is presented.

#### **CREATIVE WRITING:**

- Split up into 2 groups, to write a description of a character they create (200 words)
  - Group 1: Write about a secondary character, eg the mother of the main character
  - Group 2: Imagine you are the antagonist and explain your thoughts
- Then groups present their writing tasks.

### WEEKLY CHALLENGE:

Take a character you have created in either the game or the creative writing task and write a story about a day in their life. Try to describe the character and explore how they interact with other characters.
