

I WENT TO THE MARKET AND

- 1. Gather around as a class and stand in a circle.
- 2. Going clockwise, each student starts off from saying 'I went to the market and...', and add anything they can come up with after the sentence. The teacher take notes of the items.
- 3. Before coming up with items, students have to repeat all the previous items. If they can remember them correctly, they can add their own; if not, they are out.
- 4. Game continues until there are only two or three studnets left, who will be the winners.





WORD DOMINOS



Making the dominos

Materials

- Paper/packaging (which you can cut/tear and write on)
- Pens/pencils
- Scissors if you cannot tear material

How to make the dominos

- 1. Cut/tear some paper/packaging into strips like shown in the pictures. If using scissors ask for an adults permission/help (make around 15 strips per player).
- 2. Using a pen/pencil draw a line down the middle of each strip.
- 3. Write words on each side of the strip. Use a mixture of nouns, verbs, adjectives and **be creative!** Maybe try to write some of your favourite animals, places and foods. (Use a word bank if you need help)
- 4. Now you have created your word dominos and you are ready to play!!

Playing the game

- 1. Get into groups of 2+ players.
- 2. Shuffle the cards you've made and give them out evenly in your group.
- 3. Decide who plays first, second, third etc.
- 4. The first player should place one card down and speak aloud the words on their cards
- 5. The next player now must place a card next to the first so the first or last letter matches the previous player's card, then read the two words from the new card.
- 6. Continue with all players, placing cards down to match any of the previous which have not yet been matched.
- 7. The game ends when all players cards have been placed down.

IDEAS PAGE
